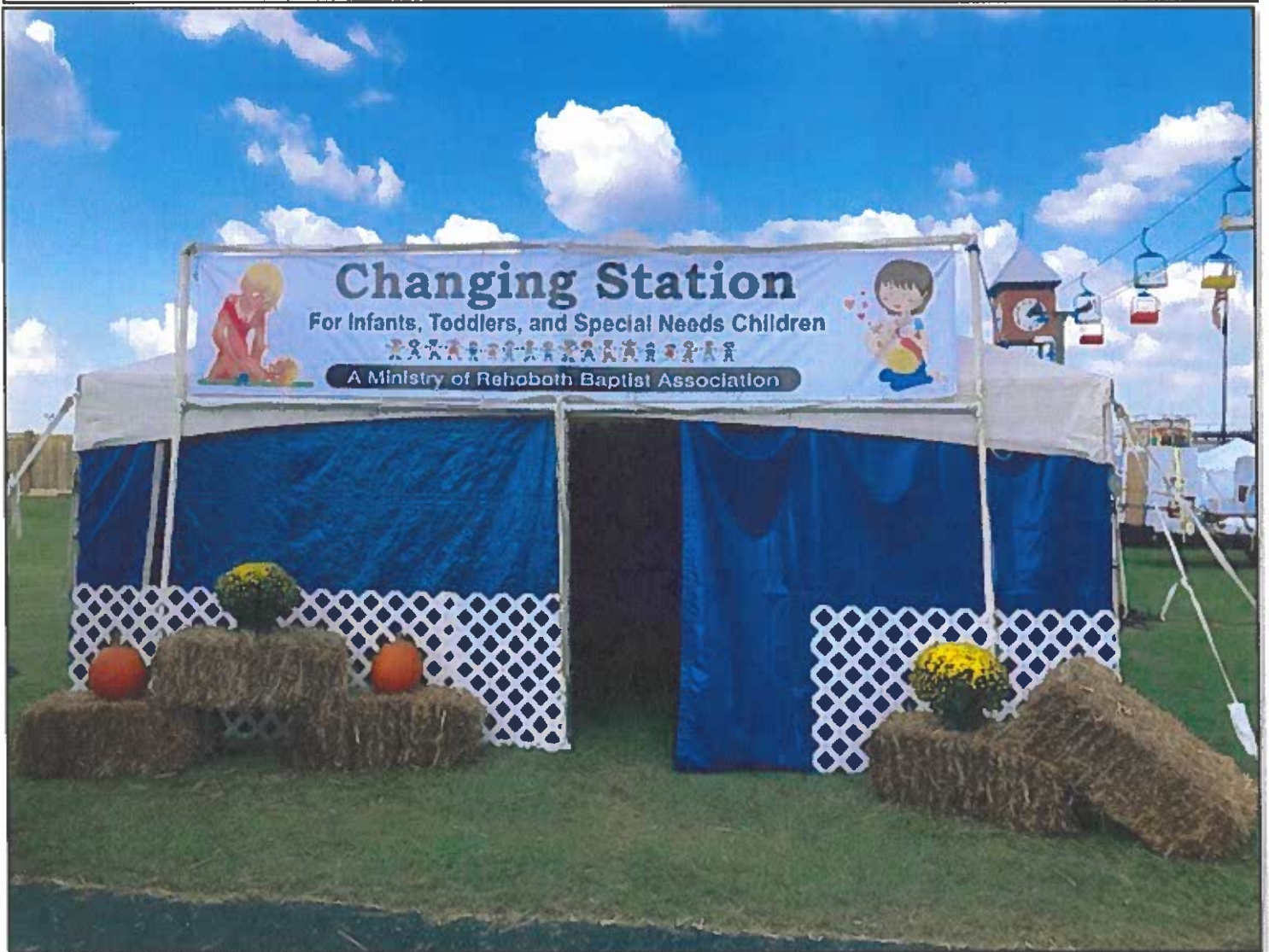

## Legends and Legacies



Earlier this month, a legend in college sports was called home. Coach Bobby Bowden coached at Florida State for more than 30 years and won a dozen conference championships and two national championship titles. Pancreatic cancer took its toll on the celebrated coach, and he went home at age 91. Twice during our years doing the Wild Game Dinner I had the privilege of meeting and talking with Coach Bowden.

I once picked him up and drove him back to the airport. I took my two boys with me because I wanted them to meet this man. Within 5 minutes of getting in the van with us, the coach knew both boy's names, what they liked to do, the names of their schools, and what teams they followed. I remained silent and listened. It was apparent to me why this man led and inspired so many young men: he loved boys and men and was more interested in hearing about them than he was telling them about himself.

Frankly, that kind of self-awareness and genuine interest in others is all too rare in our "selfie"-taking, self-absorbed world. Forgive me if I offend you, but I've often commented that social media is a platform for narcissism. You'll recall the story of Narcissus: it is told he was a Greek youth who pined away his years in love with his own reflection, until supposedly he was turned into the Narcissus flower/plant. The sad truth is many of us care way too much about ourselves.

You might be wondering what the above paragraph has to do with Coach Bowden. In a word, he was the opposite of that. He was a man who genuinely loved people and wanted to know and encourage them. Now, obviously if he had not also been a great coach, he would never have achieved the notoriety and level of success that he did. Being a "good guy" or a "people person" won't win you a national championship in a sport as competitive as football. But, it began there—with a love for people---and it extended way beyond the technicalities and disciplines of football.

How do I know? Because Bobby Bowden didn't just teach young men how to play football. He taught them about life. He taught them about unselfishness, and teamwork, and not quitting. Tributes to this kind of ethic have abounded since his homegoing. Where did he get such an ethic?

If you ever heard his testimony, Coach Bowden was a man who loved Jesus. Have you ever wondered why the Lord Jesus attracted such great crowds? Naturally, some would come in the hope of seeing a miracle or some such incident they'd heard about. But, I fully believe the reason Christ Jesus attracted the people he did was his incredible love for people. We are most like Jesus when we love and care for people—without the expectation of reward or payback.

I've not personally known many "legends" in my humble existence, but Coach Bowden was certainly one of the few. Most of us will never be a legend, but all of us will leave some kind of legacy. That is, there will be things said about us after we are called home. Much of what will be said will depend on how we are living today, particularly in how we treat people.

I think of the prophet, Elisha who lived long ago. His story is told among the pages of 2 Kings in the Old Testament. Chapter 13 tells of his death. It's rather succinct in one way: "And Elisha died, and they buried him," (v. 20). Sooner or later, that is what is written of every one of us. But, then something remarkable happened: They're hurriedly burying a man when Moabite raiders appear, and so in their haste, they let this man down into the wrong grave—Elisha's grave. "And when they let the man down, and he touched the bones of Elisha, he stood upon his feet!" (v. 21). Wow! "Why?", we might ask.

I pondered this a long time before it came to me. Are you ready for it? Here it is: "When the Power of God is upon you while you live, then the Power of God lingers about you even after you die!" I can still hear the voice of my father from 50 years ago. I can still hear my granddad, and mentors in the ministry—their voices, their words, their encouragement, their prayers! See, how we live matters because each of us, whether we are ever a legend or not, will leave a legacy. I want mine to be a Godly one, don't you?

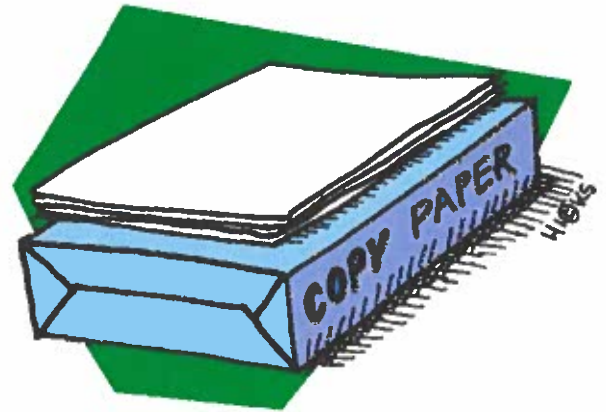

This Ministry has been blessed beyond measure. God has provided another site that is going to be active in helping the poor people of Corbin, Kentucky. We are also in contact with the city of Jellico with a follow-up conversation to be held with the Mayor and officials about the possibility of getting a building to help the people there since the pandemic has put a halt to people going to the school to get items. There will be more to follow on this, but it looks great. God is at work—we just need to ask Him, and He will provide.

The Back Pack ministry is alive and moving towards the end of this years requirements. We have a total of 1751 Back Packs required ,and we have just over 200 remaining to be built; we are in the belief that due to the donations from the churches and private parties, we will have enough money to make one last purchase of items to finish up the back packs. It is amazing how God puts a program together. It takes a lot of individuals, but they are out there just waiting to be asked; all you have to do is ask.

I want to thank all of the volunteers that come each week to pack the material, and not only on Tuesday, but they come many times on other days when we have an estate sale to pick up. They are the most giving people I have ever come into contact with. They are God-fearing people who love doing the Lord's work. Thank you so much for all of your time that you give. I want to also thank the churches that provide lunch to us on Tuesdays. It is so good to have them come and provide a sandwich or piece of pizza during the hot days for us. You will never know how thankful we are to you. If you would like to provide a meal on a Tuesday, please call Phyllis Johnson to schedule it at 478-396-9065.

Our Coat Project is kicking off. Last year we sent approx..1500 coats to the mountains, and this year we would like to beat that number as we have more people up there to support. Lightly used or new coats are required and this project will continue until the first of December when we must have them up there for the cold weather.

Lastly we still need volunteers to pick up material from elderly folks. Please prayerfully consider giving 4 hours a week to perform this duty. God will richly bless you.

Shared by a friend.....insights from a food bank volunteer. Have you ever thought about what our local pantries really need? There are so many things we take for granted in life while the needs continue to grow in our communities. I am committed to adding a few of these items to my shopping list toward making a monthly donation.

1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac & cheese in the box. But, it needs milk and butter, which is hard to get from food banks. Consider versions that don't require extra ingredients like Kraft Deluxe or Velveeta shells and cheese.
2. Boxed milk—shelf stable—is a treasure. Kids need it for cereal, which they get a lot of.
3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
4. Canned foods should be pop-tops if possible or donate some can openers.
5. Oil is a luxury needed for Rice-A-Roni which they get a lot of.
6. Spices, salt and pepper are a real gift.
7. Tea bags and coffee are caring gifts.
8. Sugar and flour are treats. (Smaller bags are easier to give a way; large bags must be broken down.)
9. Important are fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
10. Seeds are great in spring and summer because growing can be easy for some.
11. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
12. Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
13. They get a lot of peanut butter and jelly but they really NEED sandwich bread.
14. Butter and margarine are good.
15. Eggs are a commodity! (Keep in mind they must be continually refrigerated.)
16. Cake mix and frosting makes it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
17. Dishwashing detergent (along with laundry detergent and bath soap) is very expensive and is always appreciated!
18. Feminine hygiene products are a luxury and women will cry over them.
19. Everyone loves Stove Top Stuffing.
20. Shampoo, shaving items, deodorant, boxed juices for the kids are greatly needed.
21. Toilet paper is always needed, one of the most asked for and least available.

RBA provides each volunteer with a ticket to get into the fair and serve on your day and time. The BCS has proven to be a valuable ministry tool and the GNFA personnel very much appreciate the service we provide. (See the schedule below) I have a flyer for you to promote in your churches for volunteers to serve.

We also serve as an attraction to families just off the "Midway" rides section of the fairgrounds and this brings many families to the Wordless Book Evangelism tent next door to us.

### **Our ministry is really very simple:**

- We provide a clean place for parents to change or feed their babies and Special Needs children.
- We do not touch, handle, or change babies---we provide a place for parents to do that which is clean, air-conditioned, and safe.

- **Duties include:**

1. Greeting persons coming into BCS.
2. Using the wipes provided to clean/sanitize the changing pads on the tables after each changing – most of the moms coming in will use the wipes before and after to clean the area.
3. Ushering/showing moms where to go to nurse or bottle-feed babies (we have a section curtained-off for this)
4. Sharing/offering tracks and witnessing materials provided for those open to receiving them

(If you are one of the opening or closing teams for the day, detailed instructions are provided about turning on/off lights and A/C, as well as securing the tent at night). Our leadership team's contact information is also provided in case of a need).

Volunteers have chairs to sit in or you can greet or stand out front of the tent.

As you can see—it is really simple. Our goal is to be a friendly, warm Christian ministry team who shows Christ's love through service and witnesses as we have opportunity. Blessings to each of you, Tim
